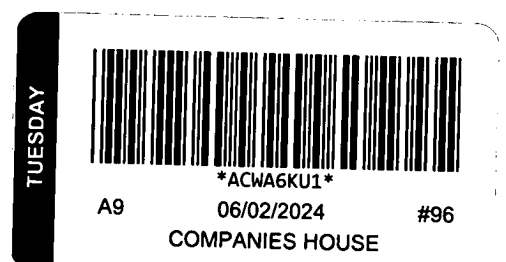

STRATEGIC REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

The Directors present the strategic report of Giesecke+Devrient ePaymants UK Ltd (formally Giesecke+Devrient Mobile Security GB Ltd) ("the Company" or "GDGBMS") for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Business Review and development and performance of the Company's business during 2022

Giesecke+Devrient ePaymants UK Ltd (formally Giesecke+Devrient Mobile Security GB Ltd) total sales in 2022 decreased from £13.3m (2021) to £9.4m. The Secure Transaction Services division continues to recover, albeit slowly, from the loss of the major customer. There have been a few small customer wins as the division begins to implement its new strategy to recovery. The Trusted Connected Devices Division sales decreased slightly to the unavailability of product in the first half of 2022.

Loss after tax increased from £1,870k (2021) to £2,921k. This increase in loss was mainly due to the loss of incurred in the STS Division. We continue to have strict control over costs.

Future Developments

The Holding Company, Giesecke+Dverient GmbH, has decided to separate the Trusted Connected Devices division into a new Statutory entity. This will allow the division to focus on a more defined growth plan separate to the Secure Transaction Services division. The date for this split is 1st October 2023.

Going Concern

The Directors' assessment has considered trading up to the date of signing these financial statements and to date revenues have been slow to recover from the major customer loss. While the Directors expect the Company to continue to generate revenues, the slow recovery rate has meant there is an element of uncertainty over predicting what will happen in the future.

The Directors have also considered the uncertainty of future cash flows and reviewed 12 months cash flow forecasts till 31 January 2025. This has been considered within the severe but plausible downside scenario. In the severe but plausible downside scenario considered, revenue has been forecasted to be 25% lower than the budgets up to January 2025.

The severe but plausible downside cash flow forecast indicates that the Company will have sufficient fund to meets its liabilities through funding from its ultimate parent company Giesecke+Devrient GmbH. The immediate parent company, Giesecke+Devrient GmbH, has also indicated that it will provide financial support to the company to meet its liabilities during the forecast period. As the company is reliant on the continued support from immediate parent company the directors have assessed the intention and ability of Giesecke+Devrient GmbH to continue to provide that support.

Consequently, the directors are confident that the company will have sufficient funds through funding from its immediate parent company to continue to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements and therefore have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Key Performance Indicators

The Directors monitor key performance indicators ("KPIs") which are considered appropriate for the Company's activities.

The Company's performance against KPIs for the year ended 31 December 2022 is set out as follows:

The Directors consider that performance against KPIs for the year as being acceptable, given the current situation in the STS Division. The decrease in Gross Margin % is directly related to the loss of a major customer in the STS Division in 2021. The company continues to refined its sales strategy and manage costs accordingly.

Principal risks and uncertainties facing the Company

The Directors identify that the principal risk is the sustainability of the Secure Transaction Division, with this in mind decisions have been made refocus the Sales strategy. This has resulted in various opportunities being identified with new customers which should provide growth in the next 18 months.

The Directors have established objectives and policies for managing financial risks to enable the Company to achieve its long-term shareholder value growth targets within a prudent risk management framework. These objectives and policies are reviewed regularly.

Risk management system

Our risk management system incorporates all the processes and organisational guidelines needed to identify, analyse, assess, and manage the Company's and the G+D Group's overall risk situation.

The degree of potential risk is quantified, and the probability of occurrence defined. GAAPS (G+D's Approach to Achieving Project Success) is a standard risk identification and evaluation procedure that is applied to customer business and associated risk across all divisions.

The Company has exposure to the following risks:

Credit risk

During 2022, the ongoing challenging credit environment has highlighted the importance of governance and management of credit risk. The Company's exposure to credit risk takes the form of a loss that would be recognized if counterparties failed to meet their payment obligations. Strict enforcement of the credit control policy ensures that the business minimises the risk of bad debt losses.

Interest rate and liquidity risk

The Company's financing costs may impact cash flow. However, exposure to this is low as there are no significant external borrowings or deposits which are linked to variable interest rates.

Foreign currency risk

The Company is highly affected by the movement in exchange rates, principally between the Euro and Sterling rates. The Company's transactions are maintained in Sterling and they make the majority of purchases in Euros. This can cause fluctuations year-on-year, and can lead to the Company making losses on contracts. Its margins are highly sensitive to forex fluctuations and the Company looking into engaging in hedging techniques in future, leveraging the Corporate Treasury Department.

Operational risk

The Company's business is subject to securing and maintaining large, significant contracts. From time-to-time these contracts become due for renewal.

Personalisation of cards is performed under the strict guidelines and rules of VISA and MasterCard. Yearly audit reviews from a physical and logical aspect are held to uphold these high standards in order to successfully continue the Operation and give our valued Customers peace of mind.

The extent to which the audit was considered capable of detecting irregularities, including fraud

The audit engagement team identified the risk of management override of controls and existence and cut off of revenue as the areas where the financial statements were most susceptible to material misstatement due to fraud. Audit procedures performed included but were not limited to testing manual journal entries and other adjustments and evaluating the business rationale in relation to significant, unusual transactions and transactions entered into outside the normal course of business, challenging judgments and estimates, testing invoices raised around the year end and throughout the year.

1. Accounting Policies

Company information

Giesecke+Devrient ePayments UK Ltd (formally Giesecke+Devrient Mobile Security GB Ltd) is a private company limited by shares and is registered and incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Globe House Unit 1, Westlinks, Alperton Lane, Wembley, Middlesex, HA0 1ER. The Company's principal activities and nature of its operations are disclosed in the Directors' Report.

Accounting convention

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in Sterling, which is the functional currency of the Company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

Reduced Disclosure

This Company is a qualifying entity for the purposes of FRS 102, being a member of a Group where the parent of that Group prepares publicly available consolidated financial statements, including this Company, which are intended to give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities, financial position and profit or loss of the Group. The Company has therefore taken advantage of exemptions from the following disclosure requirements:

- Section 4 'Statement of Financial Position' – Reconciliation of the opening and closing number of shares;
- Section 7 'Statement of Cash Flows' – Presentation of a statement of cash flow and related notes and disclosures;
- Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instrument Issues' – Carrying amounts, interest income/expense and net gains/losses for each category of financial instrument; basis of determining fair values; details of collateral, loan defaults or breaches, details of hedges, hedging fair value changes recognised in profit or loss and in other comprehensive income;

Giesecke+Devrient ePayments UK Ltd (formally Giesecke+Devrient Mobile Security GB Ltd) is a wholly owned subsidiary of Giesecke+Devrient GmbH. The financial statements of Giesecke+Devrient Mobile Security GB Ltd are included in the consolidated financial statements of Giesecke+Devrient GmbH, which are available from its registered office Giesecke+Devrient GmbH, PO box 80 07 29, D-81607, Germany.

Going concern

Notwithstanding the net liabilities of £2,523k the Directors assessment has considered trading up to the date of signing these financial statements and to date revenues have been slow to recover from the loss from the major customer loss. While the directors expect the Company to continue to generate revenues, the slow recovery rate has meant there is an element of uncertainty over predicting what will happen in the future.

The Directors have also considered the uncertainty of future cash flows, including the impact of the slow sales recovery on 12 months cash flow forecasts until 31 January 2025. This has been considered within the severe but plausible downside scenario. In the severe but plausible downside scenario considered, revenue has been forecasted to be 25% lower than the budgets up to 31 January 2025.

The severe but plausible downside cash flow forecast indicates that the Company will have sufficient fund to meet its liabilities through funding from its immediate parent company Giesecke+Devrient GmbH. The immediate parent company, Giesecke+Devrient GmbH, has also indicated that it will provide financial support to the company to meet its liabilities during the forecast period. As the company is reliant on the continued support from ultimate parent company the directors have assessed the intention and ability of Giesecke+Devrient GmbH to continue to provide that support.

Going concern (continued)

The directors are confident that the company will have sufficient funds through funding from its immediate parent company to continue to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements and therefore have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Revenue

Revenue represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the sale and card personalisation for chip and magstripe cards, the service and solution around the cards as well as the sale and maintenance of bank note processing systems, ancillary equipment and software and the provision of related support and maintenance services.

Revenue is recognised upon delivery of the chip and magstripe cards, the bank note processing systems, the ancillary equipment, and software. For the related support maintenance of the bank note processing systems, the turnover is recognised on provision of these services.

Intangible fixed assets other than goodwill

Intangible assets acquired separately from a business are recognised at cost and are subsequently measured at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses.

Amortisation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases. The Directors believe that the periods selected accurately reflect the useful lives of the assets.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are initially measured at cost and subsequently measured at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases:

Impairment of non-current assets

At each reporting period date, the Company reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any). Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

Recognised impairment losses are reversed if, and only if, the reasons for the impairment loss have ceased to apply. Where an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset (or cash-generating unit) is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but so that the increased carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset (or cash-generating unit) prior years. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the relevant asset is carried in at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal of the impairment loss is treated as a revaluation increase.

Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost comprises direct materials and, where applicable, direct labour costs and those overheads that have been incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are basic financial instruments and include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include trade and other receivables and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the financial asset is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest.

Other financial assets

Other financial assets, including trade investments, are initially measured at fair value, which is normally the transaction price. Such assets are subsequently carried at fair value and the changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss, except that investments in equity instruments that are not publicly traded and whose fair values cannot be measured reliably are measured at cost less impairment.

Impairment of financial assets

Financial assets, other than those held at fair value through profit and loss, are assessed for indicators of impairment at each reporting end date.

Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that, as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset, the estimated future cash flows have been affected. If an asset is impaired, the impairment loss is the difference between the carrying amount and the present value of the estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. The impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

If there is a decrease in the impairment loss arising from an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the impairment is reversed. The reversal is such that the current carrying amount does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been, had the impairment not previously been recognised. The impairment reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

Derecognition of financial assets

Financial assets are derecognised only when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire or are settled, or when the Company transfers the financial asset and substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to another entity, or if some significant risks and rewards of ownership are retained but control of the asset has transferred to another party that is able to sell the asset in its entirety to an unrelated third party.

Classification of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including trade and other payables, bank loans, loans from fellow Group companies and preference shares that are classified as debt, are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Other financial liabilities

Derivatives, including interest rate swaps and forward foreign exchange contracts, are not basic financial instruments. Derivatives are initially recognised at fair value on the date a derivative contract is entered into and are subsequently re-measured at their fair value. Changes in the fair value of derivatives are recognised in profit or loss in finance costs or finance income as appropriate, unless hedge accounting is applied and the hedge is a cash flow hedge.

Debt instruments where the contractual returns, repayment of the principal, or other terms (such as prepayment provisions or term extensions) do not meet the conditions to be measured at amortised cost, are subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss. Debt instruments may be designated as being measured at fair value through profit or loss to eliminate or reduce an accounting mismatch or if the instruments are measured and their performance evaluated on a fair value basis in accordance with a documented risk management or investment strategy.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when, and only when, the Company's contractual obligations are discharged, cancelled, or they expire.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when, and only when, the Company's contractual obligations are discharged, cancelled, or they expire.

Equity instruments

Equity instruments issued by the Company are recorded at the fair value of proceeds received, net of direct issue costs. Dividends payable on equity instruments are recognised as liabilities once they are no longer at the discretion of the Company.

Taxation

The tax expense represents the sum of the current tax expense and deferred tax expense. Current tax assets are recognised when tax paid exceeds the tax payable.

Current and deferred tax is charged or credited to profit or loss, except when it relates to items charged or credited to other comprehensive income or equity, when the tax follows the transaction or event it relates to and is also charged or credited to other comprehensive income, or equity.

Current tax assets and current tax liabilities and deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset, if and only if, there is a legally enforceable right to set off the amounts and the entity intends either to settle on the net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Current tax is based on taxable profit for the year. Current tax assets and liabilities are measured using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled based on tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognised in respect of all timing differences that exist at the reporting date. Timing differences are differences between taxable profits and total comprehensive income that arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in different periods from their recognition in the financial statements. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered by the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Provisions

A provision is recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, that can be reliably measured and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are recognised at the best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the reporting date.

Where the Company enters into financial guarantee contracts to guarantee the indebtedness of other companies within its Group, the Company treats the guarantee contract as a contingent liability until such time as it becomes probable that the Company will be required to make a payment under the guarantee.

Employee benefits

The costs of short-term employee benefits are recognised as a liability and an expense, unless those costs are required to be recognised as part of the cost of stock or non-current assets.

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the company is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

Retirement benefits

For defined contribution schemes the amount charged to profit or loss is the contributions payable in the year. Differences between contributions payable in the year and contributions actually paid are shown as either accruals or prepayments.

Leases

Rentals payable under operating leases, including any lease incentives received, are charged to expenses on a straight line basis over the term of the relevant lease except where another more systematic basis is more representative of the time pattern in which economic benefits from the leased asset are consumed.

Foreign exchange

Transactions in currencies other than the functional currency (foreign currency) are initially recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction.

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the reporting date. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction, or, if the asset or liability is measured at fair value, the rate when that fair value was determined.

All translation differences are taken to profit or loss, except to the extent that they relate to gains or losses on non-monetary items recognised in other comprehensive income, when the related translation gain or loss is also recognised in other comprehensive income.

2. Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the application of the Company's accounting policies, the Directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

The estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below:

Intangible assets

Intangible assets acquired separately from a business are recognised at cost and are subsequently amortised over their estimated useful economic life. The valuation of customer lists purchased in 2018 from a fellow Group subsidiary was performed by a third-party professional valuer. The estimates and judgements in their valuation included expected growth rates, attrition rates and discount rates. These valuation assumptions are inherently subjective and may in future not prove to be accurate.

Dilapidation Provision

The dilapidation provision represents the estimated cost to return the building back to its original state. The provision has been determined by a third-party property specialist.
